

Journal News – 2015

This year has been another very solid one for the Association's journal. The year started with a special issue on "New directions in pronunciation theory and practice", which included four articles and a book review and broke new ground for the Journal. At the time of writing, the four articles had averaged almost 600 downloads each, pointing to the attention the Journal receives and the interest in the topics of the special issue. Many thanks to the guest editors, Emmaline Lear, Michael Carey and Graeme Couper, who brought this issue to fruition.

Thus far the regular issue for the year has seen seven articles published, with another one or two possible before year's end. Alisa Percy and Joanne Dearlove have also been hard at work as guest editors for the conference special issue, which is aimed to be published early in the new year.

JALL's readership continues to grow as well, with there now being 720 registered readers compared to 637 this time last year. (This number does not include the number who might read articles but not register with the journal.)

As always, a big thank you to all the reviewers and to the rest of the regular editorial team: Kate Chanock, Claire Aitchison, Cally Guerin, Rosemary Clerehan, Tim Moore and Andrew Johnson who have all volunteered considerable amounts of their time to ensuring JALL continues to publish high quality work.
