

Journal News – 2021

It has been a big year for the Journal, with ten articles, one reflection and one letter being published to date, and several other papers being in various stages of the review process. Interestingly, half of the articles have been from overseas authors, with three articles being published by authors based in the UK, and two by authors based in the US.

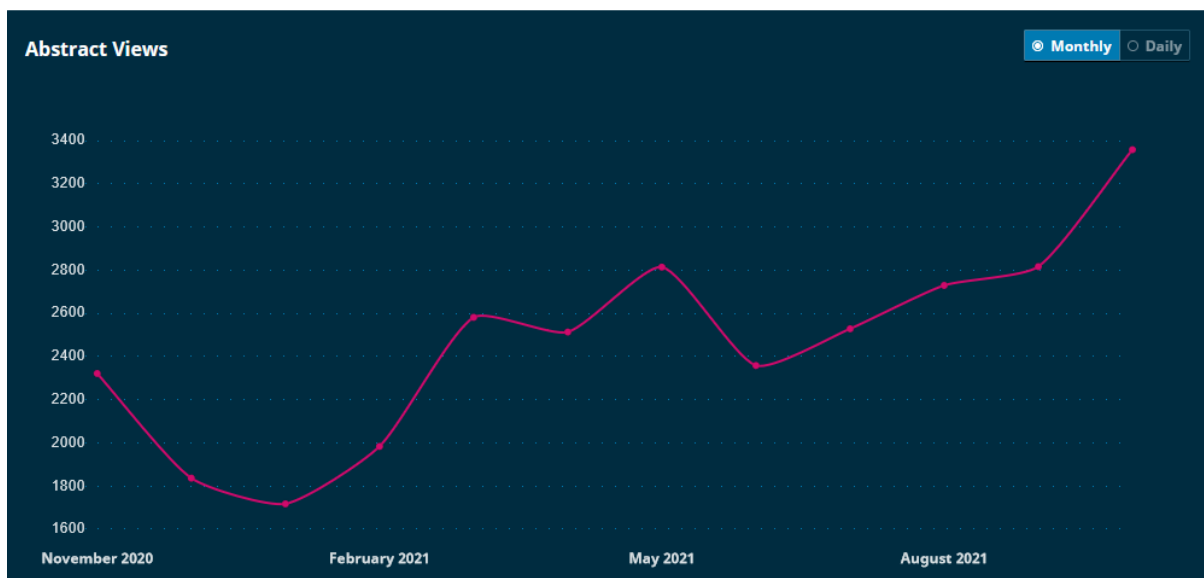


Figure 1. Number of abstract views each month over the last 12 months. Note that the vertical axis starts at 1600 views per month.

View traffic for the journal remains strong (Figure 1), with the minimum number of abstract views per month being 1717 in January, rising to a peak of 3358 for the month of October.
